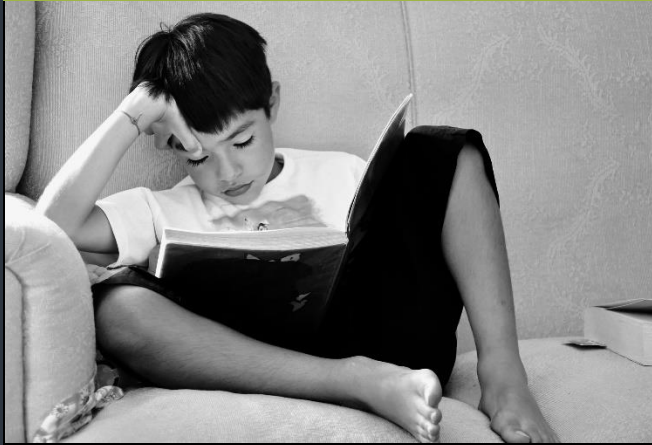
What will the training provide?

What is SENCO Induction Training?

SENCO Induction Training came out of a need for practical training in conducting the day-to-day role of the SENCO. It was developed to provide training in the areas not covered by the National SENCO Qualification.

SENCO Induction Training is not assessed; it does not require the time-consuming essay-writing and portfolio evidence-gathering. However, all training and advice is based upon current research into best practice and what has been found to be most effective. All training is framed within current UK legislation

You will need access to the data and policies within your setting



This training is particularly aimed at new and aspiring SENCOs and is tailored to the changing needs of the SENCO.

It aims to give practical training and ongoing support across the year to ensure the SENCO is confident in the role.

It is bespoke and tailored to the needs of the SENCO; developed as an outcome of personal experience and requests from SENCOs.

It provides the opportunity for coaching and support throughout the year with online access to the specialist for personalized support.

All training is delivered through face-to-face small-group seminars allowing delegates to discuss with each other, share ideas, find solutions to questions and access expertise.

Peer support is provided through a buddying system, which allows SENCOs to communicate with each other over the course of the year.

The training is designed to provide new SENCOs with the practical and day-to-day skills to carry out their role, including:

- ✓ Contextualised training, embedded within current legislation
- ✓ Person-centred coaching and support to get you on your way
- ✓ Access to additional training at a reduced rate
- ✓ Certificate of attendance

- Any new SENCO in post for up to 3 years
- Primary, Secondary, Post 16, FE
- Aspiring SENCOs
- Deputy SENCOs
- Anyone who feels they need more training in SEND Coordination

AIMS

The SENCO Induction Training course is provided as an outcome of the need for more quality and targeted training for new SENCOs. It is designed to complement the NASENCO qualification by providing the practical and day-to-day skills needed for the busy role of the SENCO. It aims to enable SENCOs to be confident in their role and to have a clear view of the changing landscape of SEND.

The course is divided into three modules for each term, which allows the opportunity for feedback and review.

COACHING AND IN-SCHOOL TRAINING
